## Sonoma Humane Society Announces Executive Director Hire

**Santa Rosa, CA** - The Sonoma Humane Society (SHS) Board of Directors announced today that Cindy Roach has been named Executive Director. Cindy has a unique combination of business and animal welfare experience that will allow her to successfully lead the organization and advance the mission of SHS.

With close to 8 years at the Sonoma Humane Society, Cindy has been serving as Interim Director since December of 2015. Her experience with the organization includes her recent role as Vice President of Programs, where she oversaw SHS's wide range of programs: Adoptions, Volunteer Services, Shelter Medicine, Behavior and Training, Foster Care, Low Cost Spay/ Neuter Services and Marketing.

Prior to her role as Vice President of Animal Programs, Cindy acted as Development Director, where she helped the organization increase donation support by 47% during her 6 year term.

"Cindy has been a valued employee of the Sonoma Humane Society for years.
