
Fostering hope

When COVID-19 hit, we immediately implemented strategies to care for our animals during Shelter-in-Place. We realized we could be shut down for a long time and, while we knew some animals would be fine with daily care and visits from the limited staff on hand, we knew others would require more constant companionship. We were also staring straight into the sweet whiskery face known as kitten season, and needed foster homes to take in the smallest, most fragile felines: bottle babies.

Enter our amazing foster volunteers! These skilled and dedicated friends stepped in to foster the animals when they needed them most. Dogs who were showing signs of being stressed at the shelter, cats who were happier to be around people all day, baby kittens who need round-the-clock care... even some bunnies!

One volunteer who rose to the challenge was Charlotte. Charlotte's family has been fostering animals with us for three years now. This super teen has not only helped her parents provide TLC to foster kittens, she has held fundraisers to purchase top-of-the-line kitten supplies and has attended conferences on her own time to learn about caring for kittens. As certain restrictions are being lifted we know you may have questions about our adoption process going forward. Currently, we are still doing Adoptions by Appointment to help you meet your match – online, of course!

Meet your next fur-baby in four easy steps:


- **1. View our adoptable pets online** at our Santa Rosa shelter: <u>dogs</u>, <u>cats</u>, <u>rabbits</u>; and at our <u>Healdsburg</u> shelter.
 - 2. Call our Adoptions Team to learn more about a specific animal and find out if they're a good fit!
 - Santa Rosa (707) 542-0882 Tues-Sat 11am-6pm, Sun 11am-5pm
 - **Healdsburg** (707) 431-3386 Mon–Sat 11pm–5:30pm
 - **3. Schedule a Meet 'n Greet!** In general, appointments can be set up within 1–2 days.
 - Dogs meet 'n greets will take place in predetermined outside spaces
 - Cats and rabbit meet 'n greets will take place via video call
- **4. Adopt!** When you're ready to adopt, all paperwork can be completed online and we'll will meet you outside ready to safely transfer your pet to you via leash (dogs) or carrier (cats, small companion animals).

News from our Shelter Hospital and Community Vet Clinic









Tux is one of those super affectionate cats who just wants someone to love him. Like many of the animals we take in, he came to us with some medical issues - and from day one in our shelter hospital, we recognized right away how special he is. He has so much love to give and we knew he was going to be the purr-fect companion once he was cleared for take off!

Ready for the good news? As we suspected, someone fell in love with Tux immediately and he was adopted shortly after

Stanley has been undergoing treatment for heartworm disease through our Community Veterinary Clinic. Stanley's dad was unable to afford consistent heartworm preventative medication until he came to the CVC.

Here Stanley is recovering from sedation following his second heartworm treatment - only one more to go! He has been handling the treatments very well and we are hopeful that he will have a full recovery. hitting the adoption floor!

Our medical efforts rely on donations and community support to provide care for the shelter animals. We also rely on adopters who are willing to welcome these special animals into their homes - especially those who may need ongoing medical care. We are so grateful for the unconditional love in our community. It allows us to continue our life-saving work by taking in more animals!

We've been seeing an increase in the number of heartworm positive dogs in this area over the past few years. Heartworm disease is spread from one dog to another by mosquitoes. While treatment can be successful, prevention is MUCH safer and easier! Thanks to our generous donors, we are able to subsidize care for pets like Stanley, and help keep heartworm disease out of Sonoma County!

HSSC Shelter Medicine and our CVC are still performing life saving procedures and surgeries during the shelter in place. We are so grateful to have such dedicated medical professionals caring for the animals who need it most.

Kibbles 'N Bits



June is Pet Preparedness Month!!

Proper planning can save valuable time, and even lives, in the event of an emergency. Think of and plan your pet's survival in the same way you'd think of any other family member. Not only do you want to prepare a "go bag" with two weeks-worth of food, water, any necessary medications and pet-related supplies (including your pet's favorite toy —





having it will reduce their stress), you also want to remember details such as making sure your pet is microchipped (and that microchip registry info is up-to-date) and wearing a current ID tag. It's also a good idea to include copies of your pet's vaccination records and any related paperwork in the kit too.

Use our handy guide as a starting point for assembling your go-bag here.

It's also critical to help your pets become comfortable with their kennel before an emergency strikes. Keeping crates and kennels out in your living environment and even feeding meals or treats in the carrier can make them seem less scary to your pets, and in turn make it easier to load up your pets in the event of an emergency.
