2020 Incoming Animals -

Surrendered: 195 Stray: 457 Transferred in: 1,030



2020 Outgoing Animals -

Adopted: 1405

Reclaimed: 149

Transferred out: 214 (this is a direct correlation to our deeply valued partnership with Sonoma County Animal Services (SCAS) receiving all underage kittens from SCAS jurisdiction, and our willingness to temporarily help any animal even if it is not suited for our adoption program)

2020 Live Release Rate - 98% (this means that, <u>thanks</u> <u>to you</u>, we saved 98% of the broken, frightened, traumatized, lonely, hungry, adorable, loving, soulful, magical, amazing little lives entrusted to our care.)

News from our Shelter Hospital and Community Vet Clinic





Our Veterinary Department began 2020 with ambitious goals....

In the public spay/neuter clinic, we hoped to boost surgery numbers by 25%. The Community Veterinary Clinic had shifted gears to accept more surgery referrals and dentistry cases than the previous year. On the shelter side of things, intakes were expected to increase by 25%, leading to a higher number of shelter animals that would require medical care.

During the first two months of 2020 we were on track – shelter intakes were up, spay/neuter numbers had increased by 43%, and the number of CVC surgeries and dentals had nearly doubled. Then came COVID-19; shelter intakes were suspended, the public spay/neuter clinic was forced to close its doors, and the CVC refocused its mission to provide urgent care only. We had to reinvent ourselves practically overnight and create new protocols to work



together without putting each other and our clients at risk.

The main surgery and treatment area was modified to make social distancing possible, and a one-way flow of traffic was mapped out to minimize contact between staff. New sanitation and disinfection protocols were implemented. Because of COVID-related drug shortages, our anesthetic protocols had to be adapted to use only veterinary-specific drugs. Paperless systems were set up, and patient intake and discharge were moved outdoors at curbside, with staff wearing full PPE. Thanks to the resiliency, adaptability, and creativity of our team, we were able to continue the important work ahead. Our goals were adjusted in keeping with our new reality. By year end, the numbers spoke for themselves:

Our Shelter Medicine team:

- · Handled 277 appointments
- · Submitted 242 sets of labwork
- Took 147 radiographic studies
- · Completed 52 dentals
- · Treated 92 medical cases
- Performed 730 spay/neuter surgeries and 32 other surgeries

Our **Community Veterinary Clinic** team:

- · Performed 1,872 exams
- · Completed 122 dentals
- Performed 175 surgeries with 40 spay/neuters added on

Our Public Spay Neuter Clinic team:

• Performed 1,217 spay/neuter surgeries on public animals

A grand total of **2,001** spay/neuter surgeries were completed at HSSC in 2020 even though the public spay/neuter clinic was closed for 2-1/2 months!

We couldn't be more proud of the focus and dedication shown by the entire veterinary department despite the challenges we faced, and we can't wait to see what we are able to accomplish in 2021!

Even as we continue to adapt and respond during pandemic times, HSSC's Shelter Medicine and CVC programs are providing lifesaving procedures and surgeries. We are so grateful to have such dedicated medical professionals caring for the animals who need it most.

Ringworm is still a pretty scary word in shelters. Oftentimes, they don't have the resources required to treat it. It's a lot of work for staff and volunteers, and the cats don't get to spend as much time with people as they'd like. Ringworm is also highly contagious and can spread to other animals (and people) if not handled properly.

HSSC has a progressive program and a dedicated group of amazing fosters who are willing to take ringworm into their home and treat it. This is a messy, smelly job that involves bathing the cat, medicating the cat, coming to HSSC weekly for appointments, and a ton of cleaning. It may not be glamorous, but it is truly lifesaving! These committed volunteers socialize and play with them every day, and help these vulnerable animals so often euthanized in other shelters.




